





LEONIE SANDERCOCK

Leonie Sandercock has been a professor in the School of Community & Regional Planning at UBC since 2001. She co-created with the Musqueam Nation the Indigenous Community Planning program in SCARP and also chaired the phd program for 15 years. Her main interest is in working with First Nations, through collaborative community planning, using the medium of film as a catalyst for dialogue, healing, community development and cultural revitalization. Her current project is a community-driven feature film (Edge of the Knife) in partnership with the Haida Nation and the Inuit film production company, Kingulliit. This film premiered at TIFF in 2018 and weeks later was awarded Best Canadian Film at VIFF. Leonie now has a SSHRC grant to evaluate the impact of the film in the Haida community. Books include Making the Invisible Visible (1998); Towards Cosmopolis: Planning for Multicultural Cities (1998); Cosmopolis 2: Mongrel Cities of the 21st Century (2003); Multimedia Explorations in Urban Policy & Planning (2010); and, with Giovanni Attili, the documentaries Where Strangers Become Neighbours (2007); Finding Our Way: beyond Canada's apartheid (2010). Leonie received the Davidoff Award (2005) from the Association of Collegiate Schools of Planning, for the best book on a social justice theme in the field of urban, regional, and community planning, for Cosmopolis 2: Mongrel Cities of the 21st Century; and the BMW Group Award for Intercultural Learning for her writing on Cosmopolitan Urbanism and for her film Where strangers become neighbours (2007). In 2012 Leonie was awarded an Honorary Doctorate for lifetime contribution to planning scholarship by Roskilde University in Denmark. And in 2015 she received the Distinguished Planning Educator award from the Association of Collegiate Schools of Planning, for her contribution to planning scholarship, education, and practice.

WEIPING WU

Weiping Wu is Professor in the Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation and Director of the M.S. Urban Planning program at Columbia University in New York City.

She also is on the faculty of the Weatherhead East Asian Institute and Columbia Population Research Center. Her research and teaching have focused on understanding urban dynamics in developing countries in general and China in particular. She is an internationally acclaimed urban and planning scholar working on global urbanization with a specific expertise in issues of migration, housing, and infrastructure of Chinese cities. She is the President of the Association of Collegiate Schools of Planning (ACSP), and a former editor of the *Journal of Planning Education and Research*, ACSP's flagship journal.



ALESSANDRO BALDUCCI

Ms in Architecture and PhD in Urban and Regional Planning, is Full professor of Planning and Urban Policies at the Department of Architecture and Urban Studies of Politecnico di Milano. Has been Deputy Mayor for Urban Planning of the City of Milan, Vice Rector of Politecnico, director of the PhD program in Spatial Planning and Urban Development, President of AESOP, founding member of EURA, the European Urban Research Association, president of Urban@it the National Center for Urban Polcies, and chair of the Italian Society of Urbanists (SIU). Visiting Scholar at the University of California, Berkeley USA (1988), and Visiting Professor at the University of Reims, France (2005), the Tongij University of Shanghai, China, the Aalto University of Helsinki, Finland, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Boston, USA (2009), the Accademia di Architettra of Mendrisio, Switzerland (2010-2016). He has directed national and international research projects among them *Postmetropolitan territories* as emergent forms of urban space: coping with sustainability, habitability and governance, funded by the Italian Ministry of University and Research, and is now the scientific director of the excellence initiative awarded at his Department on the topic of "Territorial Fragilities". He has been practicing urban and regional planning in Italy (Milan, Vicenza, Pesaro) and abroad (Shanghai, Xi'an, Dubai). He is author or editor of 20 books and of many articles and essays in Italian and English on urban planning and urban policies topics. Among the recent books he co-edited with Louis Albrechts and Jean Hillier, Situated Practices of Strategic Planning (Routledge 2017), and with Valeria Fedeli and Francesco Curci Post-Metropolitan Territories. Looking for a New Urbanity (Routledge, 2017).

Charter



AESOP's was founded in 1987 and has been registered as a non-profit association under Belgian law since May 1992.

The formal charter establishing AESOP was signed in Dortmund, Germany in 1987 and has the following objectives:

- to represent the interest of planning schools in Europe in national and international administrations and organisations, particularly within Europe
- to promote the development of teaching and research in the field of planning
- to facilitate co-operation and exchange between planning schools in Europe, and to encourage the harmonisation and equivalence of their degrees
- to articulate a European dimension within planning education as part of the process of institutional co-operation and integration within Europe, bearing in mind also the prospect of increasing professional mobility within Europe
- to foster and enrich higher education in planning across Europe by mutual support, including facilitating dialogue, exchange visits and the spread of information
- to defend the cause of expanding and enhancing higher education in planning and
- to promote a progressive approach to planning education in schools of planning by experts with a rounded view against rival claims from older-established academic units and from other disciplines and professions.

New AESOP Charter was accepted by AESOP Council of Representatives on 5th May 2012 in Oslo.

This Charter version was updated in accordance to the Belgian law on 20th December 2017.





BEN DAVY President

For more than 20 years, Ben Davy has been a professor of land policy, land management, and municipal geoinformation at the School of Spatial Planning, University of Dortmund (Deutschland). Born in 1956 in Wien (Austria), he graduated from law school in 1980. He gradually became a planner while working as research assistant and associate professor at the School of Architecture and Spatial Planning, TU Wien. His first book in English, which he wrote as the Joseph Schumpeter Fellow at Harvard Law School (1994–95), deals with the pitfalls of monorational concepts of environmental justice in the siting of hazardous waste facilities. Essential Injustice (1997) presents an early version of what Ben Davy is calling "polyrationality". Addressing many voices and many rationalities, polyrational planning demands that we "plan it without a condom" (title of an article in Planning Theory 7[3] 301–317). He is teaching BSc and MSc courses on land policy, property, cartography, real estate assessment, food injustice, border studies, and (occasionally) selfies. His favorite research strategies are doubt, curiosity, and more doubt. Humor is also OK.
